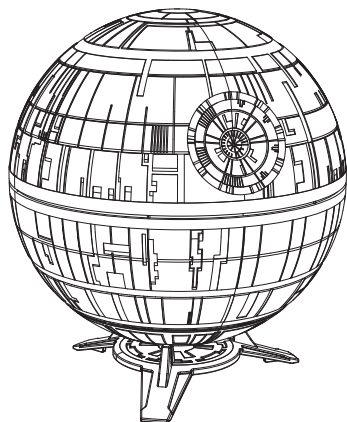

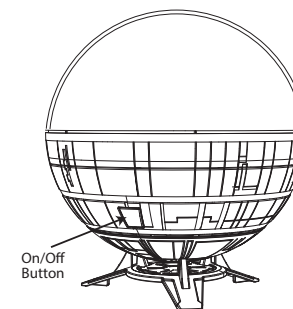

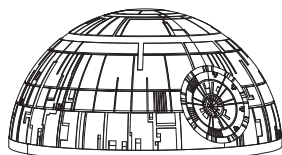
**AA/LR6 x3** Batteries not included  
Requires 3 x 1.5V AA/LR6 batteries

### OPERATING THE PLANETARIUM

1. Place Death Star Planetarium in the center of a room on a table or bookshelf. This allows the projection to cover walls and ceiling. A room with smooth light-colored walls and ceiling works best. A room that is approximately 12 x 12 feet (3.6m) provides the best projection quality. The Planetarium works best when it is located between one to six feet from the projection surface. If your ceiling is very high, place the Planetarium on a shelf or create a raised platform by piling up books for example.
2. To project the *Star Wars* Galaxy, remove Death Star Top Cover.
3. To project the stars that are visible from Earth's northern hemisphere, place the Night Sky Dome on top of the *Star Wars* Galaxy Dome.
4. Close curtains or blinds. Press On/Off button.



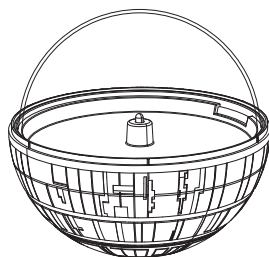

### ASSEMBLY

The below should be done by an adult.

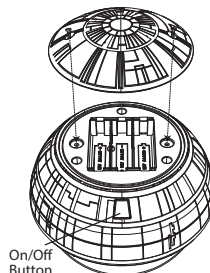
#### Installing Batteries

Tool required: Small Phillips-head screwdriver.

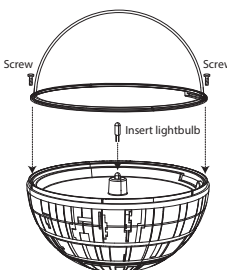
1. Turn Death Star Planetarium Base upside down. With a small Phillips-head screwdriver, remove the battery compartment cover.
2. Insert three 1.5V AA/LR6 batteries into battery compartment, making sure the "+" and "-" ends are in correct placement as indicated. Alkaline batteries are recommended.
3. Replace battery compartment cover and tighten screws.

#### Installing Lightbulb and Dome

1. Carefully insert one of the lightbulbs into the center of planetarium base. (Important: Be careful not to bend prongs of the bulb.)
2. Turn the Planetarium ON to make sure bulb lights up, then turn it OFF.
3. With a small Phillips-head screwdriver, insert screws to secure the Dome onto the Base.

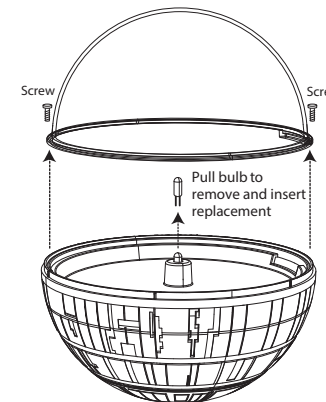
### CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Remove batteries when not in use for extended periods. Keep domes clean with a soft cloth and quality anti-static cleaner/polish. Never use abrasive cleaners.

**Bulb replacement:** Replacement bulbs are available at most electronics retailers. Halogen bulb, voltage: 3V, Current: 400 mA.

The bulb is only to be replaced by an adult.

1. With a small Phillips-head screwdriver, remove Star Wars Galaxy Dome from the Death Star Planetarium Base.
2. Carefully pull old lightbulb out of center of Death Star Planetarium Base.
3. Insert replacement bulb into center of Death Star Planetarium Base. (Important: Be careful not to bend prongs of the bulb.) Turn the Planetarium ON to make sure bulb lights up, then turn it OFF.
4. Replace Star Wars Galaxy Dome and tighten the screw.

#### BATTERY SAFETY INFORMATION

- Only adults should install and replace batteries.
- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.
- Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the toy before being charged.
- Rechargeable batteries are only to be charged under adult supervision.
- Different types of batteries or new and used batteries are not to be mixed.
- Batteries are to be inserted with the correct polarity.
- Exhausted batteries are to be removed from the toy.
- The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
- Do not dispose of batteries in fire. Battery may explode or leak.
- Batteries should be recycled or disposed of as per state and local guidelines.
